



- Featuring affordable two and three bedroom units
- The units are 1,100-1,300 square feet in space, including study alcoves for children
- It was developed by the Archdiocese of Hartford to fill a need in the community for *family* housing
- All families are able to receive support from Catholic Charities Asylum Hill Family Center

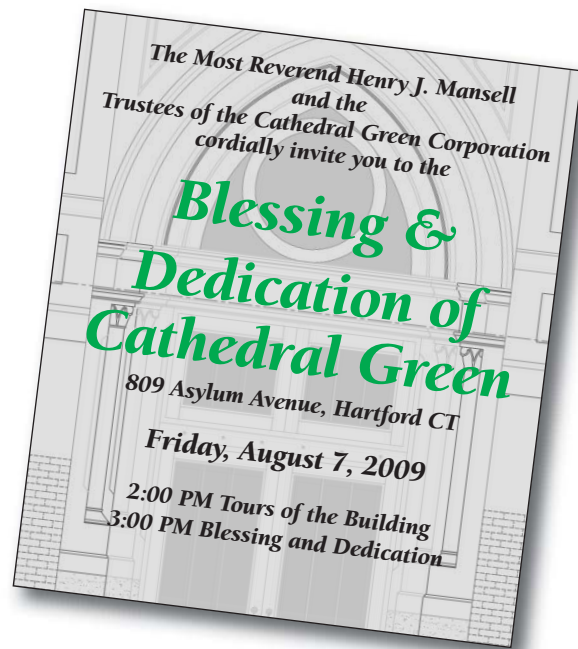
The cost of the project – \$9.1 million to renovate the 53,000 square foot building originally erected in 1923 – has been provided in large part through the Connecticut's Next Steps initiative, specifically budgeted to develop affordable housing with support services on a statewide basis.

Cathedral Green also has received support from The Connecticut Light and Power Company through a gift of \$1,000,000 in housing tax credits, and from the
