Program Provides a Family for Woman Seeking New Life

Alejandria Torres

For 12 years, Alejandria Torres worked in dentistry. She loved the way people walked into a clinic burdened with pain and walked out smiling. That transformation, that spark of relief, is what kept her going. But as steady as her career was, she believed she could do more.

She found that opportunity to do more after enrolling in the Catholic Charities BOOST program, which offers young parents and families the chance to gain a more solid economic footing. The BOOST program takes a holistic approach to removing barriers, breaking the cycle of intergenerational poverty, and lifting up the whole family. Participants train in fields that lead to jobs as community health workers, administrative medical assistants, line workers, arborists, manufacturing, and IT positions.

At first, the BOOST program provided her with practical help, including clothing for herself and her kids. But soon, the program became something bigger - a network of people who believed in her when she wasn't sure she could believe in herself.

With their support, Alejandria saw her skills in a new light. Her work wasn't just about charts and procedures, it was about caring for people, easing their fears, and restoring their confidence. That realization unlocked a dream she hadn't dared to think about

before – one where maybe one day she would support and inspire others, just as Catholic Charities had done for her.

To Alejandria, Catholic Charities isn't just an organization, but feels more like family. Not because of the resources alone, but because of the compassion — the way staff put themselves in her shoes, who listened to her, and encouraged her to see a future she could build.

Today Alejandria is on a new path, enhancing her professional skills and hoping she can help others discover opportunities they never knew existed. Reflecting on her own journey, she has said "I am looking for a doorway to help other people just like I was helped."

Mother Finds Her “Village” at New Haven Family Center

When Maria Albino walked through the doors of the Centro San Jose Family Center in New Haven, she dealt with more than just a challenging commute from a domestic violence shelter in Enfield. She carried the weight of keeping her young son, Kaleb, safe and hopeful through an uncertain time.

Kaleb struggled with separation anxiety. “He didn’t know anyone else but his mom,” Maria recalled. “In the beginning, every time he came here, he would start crying and hide under the table, and was difficult for him to meet new people.”

Gabby Cuapio, a teacher who had previously volunteered at the center, instinctively knew what to do. On one of those early days, she lowered herself to the floor, crawled under the table, and sat beside Kaleb. “I just told him, ‘Whenever you’re

ready, let’s go to class,’” Gabby said. “That’s how we started bonding — I met him where he was.”

From there, the Family Center became a lifeline. Gabby and Centro San Jose Director Sylvia Velez supported Maria and Kaleb with a School Readiness program, rental assistance, the diaper bank, and the food pantry. More importantly, the center offered encouragement, stability and hope.

“It takes a village to take care of children,” Maria said. “They were part of our village. They were such a blessing in everything we were going through.”

Over time, Kaleb began to flourish. Once a shy child who hid under tables, he grew confident and was ready for kindergarten. “He still has his moments where he asks, ‘Mommy, is everything going to be OK?’” Maria said. “I tell him, ‘Yes, everything’s going to be OK. You’ve got this. This is your year.’”

Maria and Kaleb’s story is a reminder of why the Catholic Charities’ mission matters so much.

Gabby said “We saw her grow into the person she is now, along with her family. Even though Kaleb is no longer enrolled here, he and Maria will always be part of our family.”

Looking back, Maria says she found not just resources, but community. “Catholic Charities really does stand by its mission to serve,” she said. “They were there for us in every way — and I’ll never forget that.”

2024-2025 At a Glance

3,061 Individuals of all ages received culturally and linguistically competent behavioral health services in Hartford, New Haven, Waterbury, and Torrington, including individual, group, and family therapy to address mental health issues such as anxiety, depression, substance abuse, trauma, anger management, and counseling for victims of crime

7,332 Individuals and families were provided with basic human needs, family strengthening and literacy services, parenting support, food pantry, diaper bank, employment training and placement, and other services at centers in Hartford, Meriden, Newington, New Haven, and Waterbury

526 Infants, toddlers, and pre-K children (3 to 5 years) received nurturing care, including Early Head Start and School Readiness programs, with families benefiting from nationally accredited, affordable, and year-round early childhood education programs in Hartford, Meriden, New Haven, and Waterbury

741 Seniors received supportive services through the Hispanic Senior Center, South End Wellness Senior Center in Hartford, and home-based programs that provide enrichment activities, health and nutrition, and a strong sense of community for individuals ages 55 and older

615 Hartford Public Schools elementary and middle school students and their families participated in our Community Schools programs, focusing on the whole child and family by providing extended-day programming, summer programming, and trauma-informed services that support academic, health, and social development

32 Adult adoptees, biological siblings, birthparents, and adoptive parents were assisted with searches for records on adoptions

43 Individuals received supportive housing services at Cathedral Green in Hartford and Francis Xavier Plaza in Waterbury

99 Individuals with intellectual or developmental disabilities received safe and nurturing care in our 24/7 group residences across Hartford County and our Limitless Adult Day Programs in Manchester and Newington, accommodating the special needs of each person and supporting their self-sufficiency, self-confidence, and independence

176 Families experiencing pregnancy received services from our **Home Visiting Program** team to ensure their children were born healthy. They continued after the children were born by helping with visits to pediatricians, keeping up with vaccines and other infant care.

302 Families received Parenting Support Services designed to decrease risk factors for child abuse and neglect. Our staff help parents create a positive and safe home environment for children to develop emotional, behavioral, and cognitive strengths.

These programs also foster healthy parent-child relationships and help the child in their learning process.

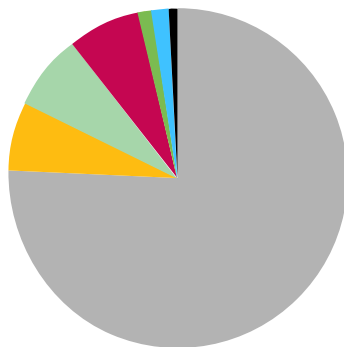

Operating Revenue

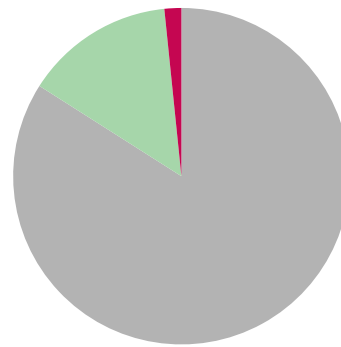

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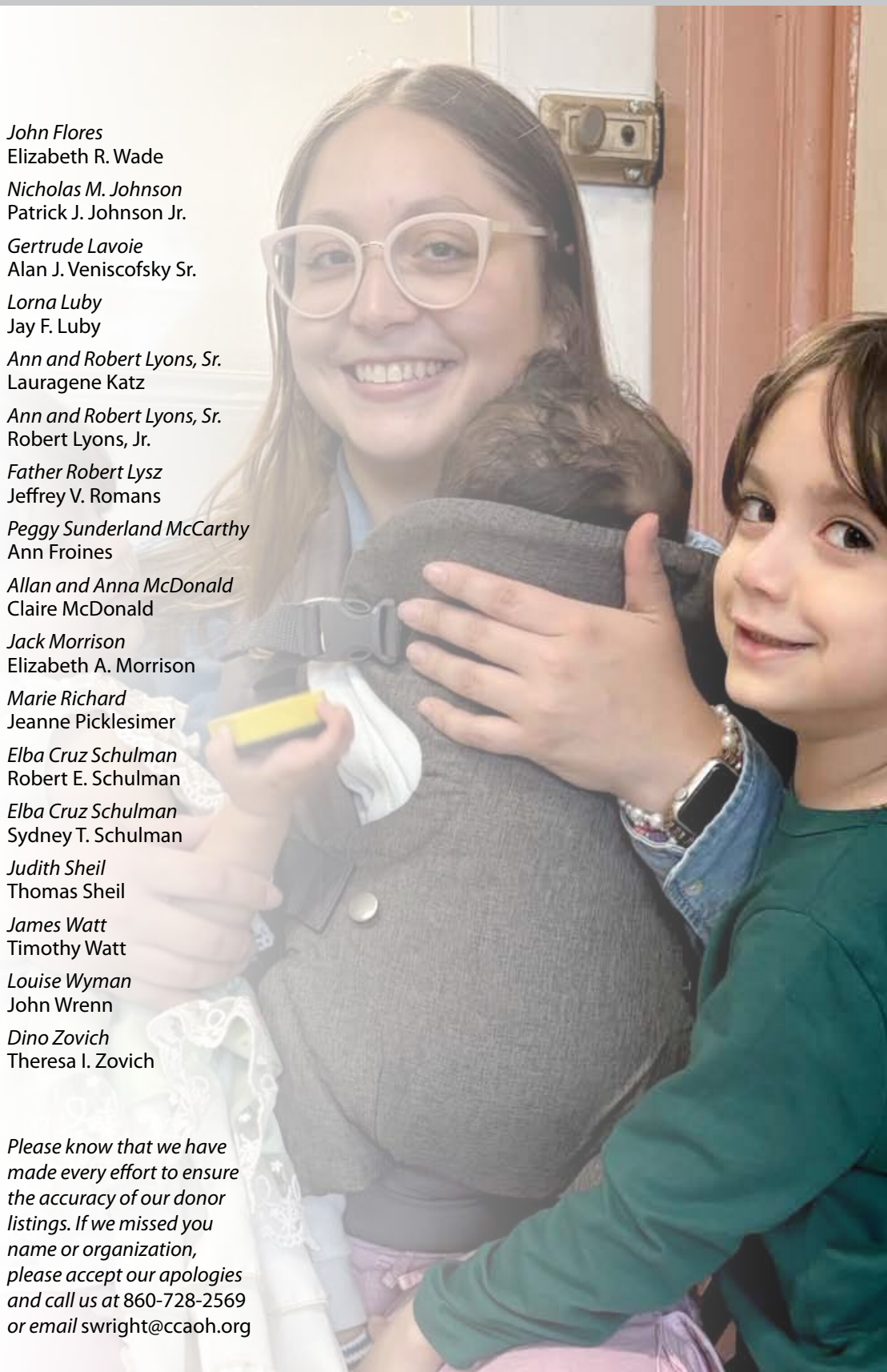
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
